RULES OF THE ASSOCIATION

I NAME AND OBJECTS

This Society shall be named "The Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers". Its objects shall be:

1. To promote ringing for divine service and to secure recognition of ringers as church workers.
2. To cultivate the art of change ringing and encourage recruitment and the instruction of ringers.
3. To promote good fellowship amongst ringers and bring all ringers into a closer friendship.
4. To endeavour to arrange instruction for bands of ringers desiring it.
5. To obtain the co-operation of church authorities in the maintenance of bells and ringing rooms in proper condition.

II MEMBERS SUBSCRIPTIONS

The Association shall consist of Qualified, Associate, Non-Resident and Life members. The amount of subscriptions for subsequent years for each of these shall be decided at an Annual General Meeting and stated in a schedule to the Rules. A proportion of the subscriptions of members shall be allocated to the Bell Repair Fund. Annual subscriptions are due on the 1st January. All new members shall be supplied with an Association badge. Qualified and Associate members shall be supplied with their appropriate cards of membership.

III ORGANISATION AND GOVERNMENT

There shall be a Gift Aid Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Within the general framework of the Association there shall be Branches.

The General Officers shall be a President, General Secretary, Treasurer, Peal Secretary, Report Editor, Composition Secretary, Ringing Master, Education Committee Convener and Librarian. Branch Officers shall be Chairmen (one from each Branch), Branch Secretaries and Ringing Masters.

The General Committee shall consist of the General Officers, the Vice-Presidents, the Central Council Representatives and two members from each of the Branch Committees. It shall have control over the funds of the Association.

There shall be a standing sub-committee consisting of the President, General Secretary, one other General Officer chosen by the President and one representative from each of the Branch Committees. The Branch Representatives shall be nominated by their respective Chairmen. Branch Committees shall consist of the Branch officers and other members.

There shall be an Education Committee. It shall consist of one representative from each Branch, not necessarily a General Committee member, and shall elect its own convener who shall be ex-officio on the General Committee. It shall meet at least once a year and shall have the power to co-opt.

There shall be an Association Librarian/Archivist.

Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be an Association Membership Manager. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Webmaster. He/she shall be appointed every three years by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Safeguarding Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be an Association Public Relations Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Bell Repair Fund Committee consisting of a maximum of twenty members including the five Custodian Trustees of the Bell Repair Fund.

There shall be a Young Ringers' group.

IV VICE PRESIDENTS

The title "Vice President" can be conferred as a mark of distinction on any person the Association wishes to honour.

V ANNUAL REPORT

The Association will publish an Annual Report.

VI INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS

Two members shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting to independently examine the accounts of the Association.

VII THE GENERAL MEETINGS

The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Saturday in May following the May Day Bank Holiday, in each Branch in rotation if possible. Two General Meetings shall be held during the year in addition, normally on the first Saturday in February and the third Saturday in September.

VIII BELL REPAIR FUND

There shall be a Bell Repair Fund.

IX CENTRAL COUNCIL OF CHURCH BELLRINGERS.

The Association shall be affiliated to this Council and shall abide by its rules and decisions.

X ALTERATION TO RULES

No alteration or addition to these Rules or Standing Orders shall be made except at one of the three General Meetings. Particulars of a proposed alteration or addition shall be notified in writing to the Secretary, placed on the agenda and announced at a General Meeting. The proposition shall not be put to the vote until the meeting following the announcement.

STANDING ORDERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

A MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

1. To be eligible for election to the status of Qualified Member a ringer shall have rung to a method either.
 - a) on tower bells 720 changes on either a working bell or the treble; or the tenor covering to 1260 changes; or
 - b) 720 changes on a pair of handbells.
2. Associate Members are those ringers who have not yet qualified for (1) above.
3. Qualified and Associate Members may apply to the General Committee for Life Membership on reaching the age of 65 years, if they have held continuous paid annual membership, either as an Associate Member or Qualified Member of the Association, for the last 30 years. Life Members may hold office and vote on all matters. Applications shall be made in writing to the General Secretary by the 31 December.
4. Life Membership may be granted by the General Committee to others at their discretion, particularly to those who have rendered outstanding service to the Association and to those who are unable to continue active ringing. Life Members may hold office and vote on all matters. Applications shall be made in writing to the General Secretary by the 31 December.
5. Qualified and Associate Members are entitled to the Report of the previous year and to vote for the election of officers when they have paid their subscription for the current financial year.
6. Ringers who are neither resident in the County nor attached to any tower in the County may become Non-Resident Members. Non-Resident Members are not eligible for election to official positions in the Association and do not have a vote at elections. (For exception see 8 below). They do not receive reports and notices issued by the Association.
7. A Member may leave the County but wish to continue his membership; if he has paid two or more Annual Subscriptions he is eligible to become a Non-Resident Member without any further payment. The change may be made by application to his Branch Secretary.
8. An election may be made before a peal attempt providing there are three or more members of the Association in the band and all of them agree to it. Non-Resident Members are eligible to vote only at such an election.

B GENERAL COMMITTEE

A quorum of seven shall be competent to transact the business of the General Committee.

C BUSINESS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

A proposition dealing with the funds of the Association shall only be put to the vote at a General Meeting. A notice of the intention to move such a resolution shall be given at a previous General Meeting unless such a proposition has been recommended by the General Committee.

D ELECTION OF OFFICERS

1. The General Officers shall hold office for three years: the President and Peal Secretary being elected for one year; the Treasurer, Report Editor and Librarian the next; the General Secretary, Composition Secretary and Ringing Master the year after that. All retiring officers shall be eligible for re-election, except that the President shall not be eligible for election for more than two consecutive terms of office.
2. Candidates for the position of President, Secretary, Treasurer, Peal Secretary, Report Editor, Composition Secretary, Ringing Master and Librarian may be either:
 - a) nominated by a proposer and seconder at the General Meeting preceding the Annual General Meeting, or
 - b) nominated by a proposer and seconder in writing to the General Secretary on or before the last day of the month in which the said General Meeting has taken place.
3. An election shall be decided by a show of hands unless six or more members request a ballot.
4. In the event of a lie the election shall be deferred until the following General Meeting, the retiring officer carrying out his duties until that date. If the retiring officer is unable to do so, the President shall nominate a person to the office until the next meeting.
5. In the event of a General Officer resigning before the expiration of his full term of office, notice of the General Officer's resignation shall be given at the next General Meeting of the Association. Candidates for election to the resigning General Officer's position may be:
 - a) nominated by a proposer and a seconder at the General Meeting at which the General Officer's resignation is announced; or
 - b) nominated by a proposer and a seconder in writing to the General Secretary on or before the last day of the month following the month in which the General Meeting took place at which the General Officer's resignation was announced.
6. The election to fill the vacancy outlined in Standing Order D5 shall take place at the next General Meeting of the Association. Such a General Meeting need not be the Annual General Meeting of the Association.
7. In the event of the resigning officer being unable to carry out his duties until a successor has been elected, the President of the Association may, after consultation with other General Officers:
 - a) nominate a person to the office until a successor has been elected, or
 - b) take such steps, if any, as he thinks fit.
8. Any General Officer elected pursuant to Standing Order D5 and D6 shall hold office only for the length of the unexpired term of the General Officer who has resigned.

E VICE PRESIDENTS

Any nomination shall, in the first place, be made in writing to the General Secretary. It must have the approval of the General Committee before being submitted to a General Meeting for voting.

F MANAGEMENT OF BRANCHES

1. Each Branch shall be managed by a Committee which includes the Chairman, Ringing Master, Branch Secretary and/or Treasurer. Two members of this Committee shall be on the General Committee. All members of the Committee shall reside or ring within their Branch.
2. At any Branch meeting only members resident or ringing in that Branch shall be entitled to vote at elections.
3. The Branch Secretaries shall collect and forward to the Association Treasurer the subscriptions of members in their respective Branches and give them their Reports, cards of membership and badges. Receipt books shall be sent to the Association Treasurer by mid-December.
4. Branches shall be entitled to hold and manage their own funds out of which all administrative expenses of the Branch are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting each year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the Branch Secretary a grant to cover the year's expenses. At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall be decided.
5. Branches shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
6. An account of the year's work in the Branch shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for the Report.
7. The name, tower and address of all resident members of the Association shall be sent to the Association Membership Manager immediately after the meeting at which they were elected.

G CENTRAL COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES

1. Nominations shall be made at the May meeting a year before the new Council meets, or in writing to the General Secretary before the end of May, and the election shall be held at the following September meeting.
2. Casual vacancies shall be filled by nomination and election at the next General Meeting after the vacancy occurs.
3. Representatives attending meetings of the Council shall be entitled to reimbursement of costs up to the maximum stated in the Schedule.

H BELL REPAIR FUND

1. Collections for this may be taken at any meeting and the amount of the collection announced.
2. The Bell Repair Fund Committee shall be responsible for the administration of the Bell Repair Fund.
3. The Bell Repair Fund Committee shall, each year, appoint a member of the Association to produce an annual Friends of the Bell Fund Report.
4. A quorum of seven shall be competent to transact the business of the Bell Repair Fund Committee.

I PEALS

1. Peals shall be recorded providing that all those taking part are Qualified, Life or Non-Resident Members of the Association.
2. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary:
 - a) details of the performance written out in the same way as in the Report on one side only of the paper;
 - b) the names of the towers to which the ringers belong and an indication of Non-Resident Members;
 - c) the names, addresses and subscriptions of any ringers elected immediately before the peal;
 - d) the peal booking fee as stated in the schedule;
 - e) the composition or its peal number in the Association's Reports.

3. These details shall be forwarded to the Peal Secretary within one month of the performance. No peal shall be accepted if reported more than two months after its performance, except that details of all peals rung in December must reach the Peal Secretary by the 31st January at the latest. The power to accept or reject a peal shall be vested in the General Committee.

J ASSOCIATION LIBRARY/ARCHIVE

The Association's Library/Archive shall be housed in The Old Palace near York Minster. The Association Librarian/Archivist shall be authorised to spend an amount up to the limit stated in the Schedule for the administration of the Association Library/Archive.

K EDUCATION COMMITTEE

1. The Education Committee shall be entitled to hold and manage its own funds out of which all administrative expenses of the committee are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting each year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the Education Committee a grant to cover the year's expenses. At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall be decided and stated in the Schedule.
2. The Education Committee shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and shall be sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
3. An account of the year's work by the committee shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for inclusion in the Report.

L YOUNG RINGERS' GROUP

1. The Young Ringers' group shall be entitled to hold and manage its own funds out of which all administrative expenses of the group are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting each year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the group a grant to cover the year's expenses. At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall be decided and stated in the Schedule.
2. The Young Ringers' group shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and shall be sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
3. An account of the year's work by the group shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for inclusion in the Report.
4. Membership will be open to all resident ringers under 19 years of age.
5. The group shall be managed by a Committee which includes a Chairman, Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer.
6. At any group meeting only members of that group shall be entitled to vote at elections.

SCHEDULE TO THE RULES

1. The annual subscription for Qualified and Associate Members and the subscription for Non-Resident Members shall be £12.00, except for those under 17 years of age or in full-time education, for whom the subscriptions shall be £6.00. Life members are not required to pay an annual subscription.
2. 40% of all subscriptions shall be paid into the Bell Repair Fund.
3. Branch grants shall be 15% of annual subscriptions (excluding Non-Resident Members' subscriptions) received in the previous year but not exceeding an amount equal to the branch expenditure during the previous year, less the cost of advertising in the Ringing World during the previous year. Applications for further funding shall be made to the General Officers of the Association.
4. Cost of badges: £3.50 each.
5. Cost of Reports to Non-Members: £4.00 each.

6. Peal Booking Fee: 50p per ringer; the whole of the peal booking fee collected shall be paid into the General Fund.
7. Central Council Representatives: Maximum entitlement - travelling expenses 20p per mile or standard class rail fare, subsistence £10.
8. The annual grant to the Education Committee shall be £500 less the cost of advertising in the Ringing World during the previous year.
9. The Librarian shall be authorised to spend up to £120 each year.
10. The annual grant to the Young Ringers shall be £500 for 2023.

RULES OF THE BELL REPAIR FUND

(The Bell Repair Fund is a Registered Charity, number 508480)

1. The fund shall be known as the Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers Bell Repair Fund.
2. The object of the Fund shall be to advance the Christian religion by providing financial assistance to churches in the Counties of the North, East and West Ridings of Yorkshire (as defined at 31 March 1972) and the City of York, together with those churches situated at the said date in Darlington, Hurworth, and Stockton on Tees in the then County of Durham for the purpose of maintaining and improving their bell installations by making grants to them. Maintenance and improvement of a bell installation shall be deemed to include the following:
 - a) Taking out an existing ring of bells, supplying and installing a new frame and fittings, recasting the bells and erecting the same;
 - b) Taking out, overhauling and re-clapping existing bells, supplying, and installing a new frame and fittings and re-erecting bells;
 - c) Taking out existing bells, overhauling existing frame and fittings, recasting, or overhauling and re-clapping the same and re-erecting;
 - d) Augmentation and bringing existing bells, frame and fittings to an adequate state of repair;
 - e) Other major repairs to bells, frame and fittings;
 - f) The provision of bells, frames and fittings and erection of the same in churches which previously had none;
 - g) The provision of sound control.
3. The membership of the Fund shall be that of the Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers as defined in the rules thereof together with such Parochial Church Councils and/or individuals as may make donations to the said Fund and thereby become Friends of the Bell Fund.
 - a) The Fund shall be administered by the Bell Repair Fund Committee of the Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers, hereinafter referred to as "The Committee". The Committee shall consist of the Custodian Trustees, and other members appointed by the General Committee. Each member of the Bell Repair Fund Committee shall meet the legal requirements to act as a Charity Trustee. The committee shall elect the BRF Secretary who shall be an ex-officio member of the General committee.
 - b) The Committee shall have the power, after considering an application submitted to it in writing, to approve a grant from the Fund. The committee has the right to withdraw the offer of a grant. The Committee also has the power to reduce the grant given if less work has been completed than planned.
 - c) The Committee shall have the power to appoint sub-committees which shall report back their actions fully and promptly to the Committee.
 - d) The Committee shall have the power to co-opt such persons as it considers necessary to assist in its deliberations. The number of co-opted persons at any one meeting of the Committee shall not exceed three.
 - e) The President, General Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall be ex-officio Custodian Trustees of the Fund and two other members of the Association elected at the Association's Annual General Meeting shall act as Custodian Trustees of the Fund.

- f) Such bank accounts as may be required shall be opened in the name of the Fund. Any two of the five Custodian Trustees shall have the power to sign cheques.
- g) Any outstanding monies in the hands of the Committee not required for the immediate purposes of the Fund shall be invested in any manner authorised by law.
- h) The Committee and its sub-committees shall have the power to raise funds by any means they see fit as long as permanent trading is not engaged in.
- 4 In the event of the dissolution of the Fund any remaining assets of the Fund shall be distributed by the Custodian Trustees to Charities with similar aims to the BRF.
- 5 The Treasurer shall prepare a balance sheet as at the 31 December in each year and an income and expenditure account for the year ended on that date which shall be independently examined by independent examiners and be presented to the Annual General Meeting of the Association first held after 31 December in which the Fund's accounts are prepared. The independent examiners shall be elected annually by the members of the Association at their Annual General Meeting.
- 6 No alteration or addition or deletion of these rules shall be made so as to cause the Fund at any time to cease to be a charity in law. No alteration addition or deletion shall be made except at a General Meeting of the Association. Particulars of a proposed alteration, addition or deletion shall be notified in writing to the General Secretary, placed on the agenda and announced at a General Meeting. This proposition shall not be put to the vote until the General Meeting following its announcement.

RULES FOR THE FINAL OF THE SUNDAY SERVICE BAND STRIKING COMPETITION

These rules apply to the final only, giving the opportunity to operate under different rules at Branch level if desired.

A GENERAL RULES

1. This competition is a six bell competition based on Sunday Service bands and will consist of two stages:
 - a) Preliminary competitions arranged by each Branch, for towers in the Branch area.
 - b) A final competition held between the winners of the Branch competitions. In the event of a Branch not holding a competition the Branch Committee may wish to nominate a tower to take part in the final. In the Final each Branch will be represented by a tower within the area of that Branch.
2. All participants in the competition must be members of the Association.
3. Bands entering the competition will consist of regular Sunday Service ringers of the tower represented. Should this not be possible, one visitor will be allowed to ring, but a penalty will be awarded against any band which includes a visitor.
- 4.

B RULES RELATING TO RINGING IN THE FINAL

Teams will be allocated a time (20 minutes is allowed per team) before the event and should endeavour to be prompt – reducing their practice time if necessary.

1. Call Changes. The test piece will consist of not less than 240 rows counting from the first call change during which at least two pairs of bells per minute must be changed.
2. Method Ringing. The test piece shall be either:
 - a) 240 doubles (with a cover) – either two 120s rung consecutively or a 240 with each change repeated once, or
 - b) A true touch of 240 changes of minor.
3. On entering the tower each member of the band may try his/her bell for length of rope for a few whole pulls. Bells should be tried individually and in order treble to tenor.

4. A practice piece must be rung and shall consist of up to three minutes ringing. At the end of three minutes, including the opening rounds, the bells must be stood.
5. After a short break the test piece will follow and must be preceded by a period of rounds not exceeding one minute. Marking will commence from the first change after the opening rounds and continue to the end of the test piece, or 240 rows from the beginning of the first call change.
6. A person appointed by the Association Ringing Master or a person appointed by the organiser of the event is to remain in the tower while each band rings. Usually a member of the previous band is asked to remain behind to steward the next band. He/she may advise the band on the time they have available in their ringing.
7. Any person having grounds for complaint about the competition is to communicate this to the organiser who must pass it on to the judge before the result is declared.

C RULES RELATING TO THE JUDGE

1. A judge shall be appointed by the Association Ringing Master or by the organiser of the event and may be offered expenses.
2. A band that includes a visitor will incur a penalty of 15% additional faults.
3. The band with the lowest number of faults after adjustment of visitor's penalties shall be the winner and receive the trophy.

The judge's decision on any matter of dispute shall be final.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This report covers the 9 months since the AGM of the association last May, at which I was elected President of the Association. Since then we have had a busy time with Association Meetings and events and the continuation of the review into our structures and way of doing business, started under Barrie Dove.

I will report on both the usual business of the association and on the outcomes of the review and action being taken to put the changes into effect.

The association held the normal meeting in at Rotherham where we were very warmly welcomed by the Clergy and ringers, who organised an excellent early evening meal of pie and peas. The Minster at Rotherham is a noble and ancient Church, and it was a pleasure to have the service and food in the nave of the Minster, where we also held the business meeting. At this meeting, apart from the usual business, we discussed the strands of the review where strand leaders gave a short report, and questions were put from the floor of the meeting in an excellent and wide-ranging discussion on each of the points raised. After the meeting we rang on the magnificent 12 bells of the Minster, it was a pity that more members couldn't join in the ringing after the meeting.

In November an extraordinary meeting of the General Committee was held at which the review outcomes were discussed in detail. It was agreed to put a motion to the January meeting of the association giving notice of a change of standing orders, to be voted on at the AGM, to remove the Associate Member category of member of the association and to move to a single level membership, not counting Life Members and Honorary Members. The Committee felt that the time was right for this change. We shall find out at the AGM.

The ringing master and the general secretary will report on events organised under their offices including 12 bell sessions and other ringing events such as striking competitions.

We held the Snowdon Dinner, as usual, on the usual Saturday of the year in York. It was a small but select event and we were delighted to hear of the experiences of running a significant Ringing centre in Darlington from Chris and Anthea Enzor, who did a double act in making the presentation. The Snowdon Dinner gives the association the opportunity to come together in a social event that celebrates the achievements of a significant group of pioneers who led

the early developments of the association. It is the only annual event of the association which could count as a purely social event. I hope that members can come to the 2024 event, again in York, in greater numbers as unless we can support this event it may well have to cease in times of increased costs. I look forward to seeing you in York in October.

The association needs to recognise that a flow of people into office at the association level is key to our future. We still have a vacancy for the post of Report Editor. We cannot rely on those in post staying and must look to ourselves to bring people on to fill these rolls in the future.

YORKSHIRE YOUNG RINGERS (YORKSHIRE TYKES)

2023 was an epic year for the Yorkshire Tykes. The early part of the year saw us preparing to co-host the RWNYC on home turf in York. Early practices saw record numbers of young ringers joining our ranks. So, for the first time ever, we were able to enter an 8-bell method team and an 8-bell call changes team, plus have plenty of reserves. Serious training began alongside our regular monthly meetings.

The method team scored an excellent quarter of Plain Bob Triples at Harrogate St. Wilfrid, and the call changes group worked on their preferred sequence of calls. It's the first time we have entered the call changes section and it proved quite difficult to establish our preferred system of calling, half the team usually call "down", whilst the other half normally call "op". We also found that call changes put much more pressure on the conductor than a short touch of a Triples method does.

Hosting the contest also gave us the opportunity to call on our former Tykes to join us as stewards and helpers on the day. It was fantastic to see so many of our alumni running the ringing sessions and handbell workshops at York Minster throughout the event. The RWNYC itself was a resounding success with a record 28 Tykes attending and about 30 family members acting as helpers. Both teams performed extremely well with the method team being the only band in their section to ring a touch of Triples.

This was not the end of the action on the RWNYC weekend. Alex Riley had suggested that it was about time we attempted a Tykes peal. So, whilst some of our former members were home for the weekend, not one but two peals of Cambridge Surprise Minor were scored almost simultaneously on a very hot Sunday afternoon. We thank Alex Riley and Ewan Hull for conducting these peals and hopefully many more will follow soon.

In September six members of the squad took part in the YACR 6-bell striking contest ringing 240 changes of Plain Bob Doubles, another first for our group, and they didn't finish last...!

When it was suggested that the Tykes should enter a team in the White Rose 12-Bell Contest they jumped at the chance to participate. Only one practice was possible, at Ossett, before the contest itself on 21st October at Ripon Cathedral. Not all the team could attend the practice but on the day 10 current Tykes ably assisted by former Tykes, Alex & Luke Riley, formed the team. The test piece was a plain course of Plain Bob Cinques. The ringing went extremely well and was praised by the crowd of people listening outside the tower. Whilst we didn't trouble the established 12-bell bands it was a marvelous achievement for our young team. Watch out we'll be back in 2024...!

So onwards and upwards into 2024. We're looking forward to RWNYP London 2024, to entering the White Rose Contest again, to ringing more peals and quarter peals, and to celebrating our 10th Birthday in the summer. The Tykes welcome all young ringers from across Yorkshire to our monthly meetings. Many thanks go to our wonderful parents for their tremendous support, and to all the towers we have visited for making us so welcome.

Allocations During 2023

We gave grants to the following projects in 2023:

Melsonby - Grant £10,000; **Barnoldswick** - Grant of £1,000

We have two grants outstanding from before 2023:

Queensbury - Grant £100; **Scarborough** - Grant £1,000

We have had two towers where we offered a grant but have now lowered the level of grant to “Support”. This is where we have said we will support a project but have not given a specific grant figure. One tower with this status is:

Laughton en le Morthern: They are having work done on the tower and will be reapplying for a grant when that work is done. This will be a transferred ring of bells from outside of Yorkshire. We hope this is going to be quite soon and that they will be in a position to update us.

Holme on Spalding Moor: The work of the local ringers to run the Bubwith project took some hard work. There is a break before pushing on with this project.

There is one thing to note, after long periods of bells not being rung, the Central Council guidance is still to check your bells and make sure everything is how it should be in the belfry. It is always worth remembering that ongoing maintenance can help prolong the need for expensive refurbishment work.

We are looking at various ways for finding homes for bells where they are no longer needed in their current churches. I ask members to keep me informed if they know of any churches that may be closing and bells that might be becoming available for transfer. Also, if you know of a church where towers could rehouse second-hand bells, please let me know at the earliest opportunity. We now have a list on our website of any Yorkshire bells that are available to be transferred to other towers. We have some towers in the county looking at options for bells from the Keltex Trust.

There are a few interesting projects currently in the early stages across Yorkshire. Projects can take a few years to come to fruition, but it looks promising that Yorkshire will have some more refurbished rings for everyone to enjoy.

Trustees are appointed every year by the General Committee. If you would be interested in becoming a Trustee, please contact me or the general secretary. As we fall within the rules set out by the Charities Commission there are certain conditions which apply as to who can become a trustee.

The next two meetings of the Trustees will be held in September 2024 and February 2025 to consider applications for support and grants. The closing dates for applications are 30th June 2024 and 31st December 2024 respectively. Applications should be submitted using the YACR BRF form A and sent to the BRF Secretary: Peter McCoy, 32 Clough Grove, Oughtibridge, Sheffield, South Yorkshire S35 0JX. If you are considering a project, please contact me so that I can supply you with the correct form and offer any advice you may require.

For further information to allow for a full understanding of the financial affairs of the Bell Repair Fund, the full annual accounts and the Trustees’ annual report should be consulted. Copies of these documents are obtainable from the Association Treasurer for a reasonable fee to cover costs or alternately we have the most recent full reports available for download on the YACR website.

BRANCH REPORT

We were delighted to hear that David Town was awarded a British Empire Medal (BEM) for services to ringing.

The branch committee saw some new faces elected at the AGM held at Northallerton in March. Many thanks to them for the efforts they've made this year. Following conversations with some new members, the committee, led by Pat Jones, created a "welcome letter" for all new members. Special thanks to Pat and to the two recently joined members (one new to ringing and one who moved to the area) for providing feedback.

We were sad to see the departure of our Membership Secretary, Jonathan Couchman, who moved out of county to Northern Ireland. We wish him well and thank him for his huge contribution to ringing in our area over many years, both as a committee member and working directly with towers in the Wensleydale area, including his involvement with the restoration of the bells at Middleham. Indeed, Jonathan was part of the Wensleydale cluster that won “The ART Award for Excellence in Recruitment and Retention”. Jonathan, along with David Scrutton, appeared on the “Fun with Bells” podcast (S5 E11 - 13 July 2023) to talk about the successful recruitment scheme which led to them receiving the award.

Our first branch practice was held at Northallerton in January. Following on from the AGM in March, a training day was held for the Wensleydale ringers in Middleham led by Neil & Dinah Donovan. The first ART M1 course in the branch for a while was held at Masham in June while Ripon hosted a 12 bell practice in July. The King’s Coronation led to a host of ringing. We entered a team in the 8-bell inter-branch striking competition at the Association AGM in May, finishing 3rd, just 5 faults behind the joint winners. Points of interest

Obviously the most important event during the year was the Coronation of King Charles III. This was celebrated in fine style by ringers and is reflected in the numbers with May having by far the most quarter peals. There were 42 quarters specifically for the Coronation. Michael Stephens rang a QP for the previous Coronation as well as one for Charles III. As an aside, it is worth noting that the national initiative - 'Ring for the King' – led to the training of a large number of new ringers, and many of these joined in general ringing across Yorkshire for the Coronation. Hopefully many of these 'new' ringers will be ringing a QP in the near future. According to footnotes, 163 towers had general ringing for the occasion. Several members who rang for the previous Coronation, including Alan Ainsworth, David Thorley and Susan Hobson (apologies if I have missed anyone else), took part in general ringing. Quite a few Towers used the opportunity to publicise ringing – for example Kildwick had something like 75 local residents 'having a go' and Goldsborough had 25 villagers chiming. It was good to see that several 3 bell towers and chimes made a noise. At Cottingham, there was ringing on a bell cast during the reign of Charles I.

As usual, there was also ringing of Quarter Peals for Sunday Services, birthdays of ringers and their friends and relatives, weddings, in memoriam, births and christenings, and special services. Despite the increase in overall numbers, there were fewer first QPs and firsts as conductor in 2023 than 2022. Tower Captains, teachers and QP organisers should see that this downward move is something they can remedy. Quarter Peals are an excellent way to consolidate the learning of a method, give the learner a great sense of achievement and lay a sound foundation for the future. In contrast to this, it is worth pointing out that there were a lot of firsts in method, and there was a lot of variety in what was rung. Special mention for the Western Branch, centred on the QP week but throughout the year as well, with many experienced ringers being given an opportunity to develop their method repertoire. Annie Faulkner is an excellent advertisement of what could be achieved - first QP in May 2022, 8-spliced on handbells in December 2023 (unfortunately not for the YACR). Well done to Annie and to all involved in supporting and training her. Also to note is the Leeds Minster development plan (LMSCR firsts in 2023) which realised 179 firsts – not all with QPs and not all attributed to YACR. Congratulations go to all involved.

Although the leading method was Plain Bob Doubles, there were also at the other end of the scale QPs of Glasgow S Major and Zanussi Maximus.

591 ringers are well over half of the Qualified Members of the Association. This is excellent, and should be recognised as an achievement of the Association, but what about something for the other half, and what about working to 'upgrade' the Associate Members? In comparison, the number of Peal ringers is roughly 150, about one in seven members. Yes, important, but involving far fewer members.

One final statistic - in September there were 61 Quarters rung in Yorkshire not attributed to any Association / Guild. Almost all of these were by YACR members. Conductors, please note that the whole success story is not being told.

CCCBR has recently produced its General Statement on Safeguarding Children in Towers which may be found on its website at <http://www.cccbr.org.uk> on the Tower Stewardship heading under the Committees Tab. All ringers are urged to familiarise themselves with it. The relevant points for YACR events are given below.

YACR activities do not usually fall within Regulated Activities as defined by the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 and amended in 2009 and further amended by the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012.

YACR Ringing Activities I REQUIRING DBS check are those carried out on a regular* basis OR involving overnight stay (e.g. weekend courses):-(*regular is 30 hours per month or more)

- **The YACR member acting as Lead Tutor must hold a current DBS Enhanced Disclosure Certificate;**
- **Checking is the responsibility of the YACR Safeguarding Officer**

YACR Ringing Activities NOT requiring DBS checks are:-

- Teaching children **under supervision** of a DBS checked leader
- Helping children by ringing another bell or standing behind

- General ringing at practices, meetings or on outings
- Visitors to towers
- One-off teaching or deputising
- Transporting juniors as a one-off **domestic** arrangement
-

Sunday Service ringing and local tower practices are always the responsibility of the parish and so YACR offers the following advice and information:-

The CCCBR document “Good Practice for Maintaining a Safe Environment in the Belfry for Young People” **should be displayed in every Ringing Room**

All Tower Captains & Deputies should establish a working relationship with the Parish Safeguarding Officer who has a vital role to play in the recruitment of new ringers, or in the welcoming of established ringers coming into an established band. See *Safer Recruitment Practice Guidelines* below.

All Tower Captains & Deputies should be DBS Enhanced Disclosure checked if there are children in the band. As should any ringer involved in the training of children. All parish based training should always be carried out by at least two adults, preferably comprising both sexes.

The Church of England has implemented two Policy Documents: *Promoting A Safer Church* and *Safer Recruitment Practice Guidelines*. Both of these affect all ringers. The first recommends Safeguarding Training to be undertaken at *Basic Awareness* level (formerly **C0**, see below). Tower Captains and Deputies need to attain *Foundation* and *Leadership* (formerly levels **C1 & C2**, see below). Details of the Course Levels are:-

Basic Awareness (formerly C0). Online learning only. Covers the basic principles and sets the context for *Foundation Training (formerly C1)*. Time required is about 1 hour. All ringers are strongly encouraged to complete.

Foundation Training (formerly C1 & C2). For Tower Captains & Deputies and Ringers in roles involving work with children or adults at risk. Online only. Online about 90 minutes, classroom 3 hours. For ringers in those categories YACR also offers a classroom based module for those who have completed the online courses to enable members to build on the issues through local conversations focussed on ringing scenarios. This is organised at Branch Level, so please speak to your Branch Secretary for local details.

Leadership Training. This is a new module which is not expected to involve the majority of ringers.

Completion Certificates are issued after each course. These should be retained and, if necessary, produced prior to ringing at places other than the home tower.

Refresher training to take place every three years.

Safer Recruitment Practice Guidelines establishes new criteria for all voluntary roles including ringing. To be implemented at Parish level. It sets out a process for all new learners and established ringers joining a local band to provide information about themselves and agree to abide by the ethos of the Parish. It is suggested that for new learners the process need not be implemented until a level of competence is reached whereby regular membership of the band is offered. The **Parish Safeguarding Officer** needs to be involved at that point as a Confidential Declaration is requested, **and it is not the duty of Tower Captains or Deputies to be present for that.**

DBS Certificates are obtainable free of charge by application to the Parish Safeguarding Officer. In **exceptional** circumstances, e.g. ringers unattached to a parish, application may be made to the YACR Safeguarding Officer who will seek processing through the relevant diocese. A charge will usually be involved.

PRIVACY NOTICE

The following is an abbreviated version of the YACR privacy policy. We keep our privacy policy under regular review and the full, and most up to date, version can be found on our website at www.yacr.org.uk/privacypolicy.

What information do we collect about you?

If you are a member we will record your name, address, membership status, and if a resident member, also your home tower. You may opt to provide an email address or telephone number so that we can keep in touch about forthcoming events.

If you are a tower contact we will record your name and a means of contact: any or all of postal address, telephone number and email address.

If you make a donation to our Bell Repair Fund, purchase any of our products or services, make a booking on a course, or apply or enquire about a grant from our Bell Repair Fund we will record your name and any, or all, of postal address, telephone number and email address. We will record your payment details.

If you attend a meeting or event organised by us we may record your name on an attendance register. We may record in a written record, such as the minutes of the meeting, your activities during such a meeting or event.

If you provide a service or product to us you must provide within an invoice details to identify yourself and bank account details which we shall record.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information to allow us to process and maintain our membership records, to reclaim tax paid under the Gift Aid scheme and optionally to inform you about forthcoming events. We will never share this information with any other organisation, or third parties, for any purpose, including marketing, except where required to by law.

If you are a Tower Contact, your information will appear in our Annual Report and, with your permission, your name and telephone number will also be listed on our website to enable visiting ringers to make contact. These details may also be given to ringers from outside the Association who wish to contact you to arrange to visit your tower.

We do not perform any kind of automated data analysis, sometimes called profiling, on the data collected.

We will never publish contact information of members without the explicit written consent of those members.

We will publish all members' names and individual YACR peal records, together with details of the peals rung for the Association, in the printed annual report each year. The details of all peals rung for the Association are also available on our website.

Officers may need to have contact details published in order to carry out their duties effectually and they must provide written consent as to which contact details they wish to have published in the annual report, our website and other relevant media.

Access to your information and correction

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REQUEST A COPY OF THE INFORMATION THAT WE HOLD ABOUT YOU. IF YOU WOULD LIKE A COPY OF SOME OR ALL OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION, PLEASE WRITE TO THE GENERAL SECRETARY. WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS ACCURATE AND UP TO DATE. YOU MAY ASK US

TO CORRECT OR REMOVE INFORMATION YOU THINK IS INACCURATE OR WHICH YOU NO LONGER WISH TO SHARE WITH US. PLEASE BE AWARE HOWEVER THAT WE MUST RETAIN SOME INFORMATION ABOUT YOU IF YOU WISH TO REMAIN A MEMBER OR BE A TOWER CONTACT, OR IF YOU WISH TO RING PEALS FOR THE ASSOCIATION AS A NON-RESIDENT LIFE MEMBER.
