LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The Library and Archive of the Association is held as part of the Minster Library and Archive in the Old Palace to the east of the Minster. For ease of access and searching the whole of the Minster Library and Archive, including our records, are part of the University of York's electronic system. For full details and access to the catalogue please go to the association's website at <http://www.yacr.org.uk/library.html>

This has been an unusual year for all aspects of the YACR's activities and, newly elected, for one year, to the Librarian's post in February 2020 shortly before the first COVID-19 lockdown. I quickly realised that COVID would also have implications for me as I picked-up the challenge of continuing to keep the YACR collection in good health. Consequently, establishing myself in the post and determining the next steps after Bob Cater's good management of the past several years has not run quite as I initially planned and, whilst all has continued to run smoothly for the YACR library over this year, there is little development to report.

An early visit to meet the staff who run the York Minster Library and Archive where the YACR collection is held, and to view the collection was scuppered at an early stage. A small number of General Committee members were also keen to join in the visit but regrettably initial arrangements fell at the first COVID lockdown barrier and we are still waiting in eager anticipation for the time when it may be sensible to arrange a visit to meet staff and continue the good relationships established and sustained in the past with the Minster and University of York staff. Hopefully this visit can take place in spring or early summer 2021.

I am pleased to report that, in one respect, there has been no change: donations to the collection have continued.

As we all know from our personal and working lives, 'stuff' accumulates rapidly and for all archivists and librarians, the arrival of donations brings mixed emotions: extreme joy at what lands in front of them and extreme disappointment that some will need to be returned to the donor. Space is the perennial challenge for every collection across the world – large and small. There is simply never enough space or resource to house everything that is donated, however interesting and worthy in its own right it may appear to be. Each item added to our collection must be deemed by the Old Palace's staff to be 'worthy of holding' and this judgment is informed not only by the intrinsic merit of the individual item but also by an analysis of how it fits within the overall purpose and intent of the collection.

As we know from our experiences of everyday life, there are those of us who deal with the accumulations of 'stuff' swiftly, with clear intent and purpose to meet well determined outcomes associated with keeping the accumulation of 'stuff' to manageable proportions and our surroundings 'tidy'. Others accumulate as their intended (or actual) outcome! I put myself in this latter category of people, known to some as 'hoarders', to others as 'collectors', 'custodians for the future', 'saviours of the past', or simply 'people who have homes stuffed full of all sorts of things'.

The professional responsibility of any librarian or Archivist is to straddle these extremes with thoughtful and due consideration of what it is feasible to retain; especially, how much of it, given the physical storage space available and the effective management of the associated administration and safekeeping work associated with any professional archive or library. Every new donation must be

accessioned into the rest of the collection, with unique IDs, individual records noting size, shape, condition and similar information. With luck these summary records of each object/paper can then be made available to the interested public through catalogues or similar, located easily in the collection, and kept in good condition.

Whilst we have some broad principles for what to collect and what not to collect in YACR, I decided that one of my first jobs should be to adopt the same 'good practice' as professional libraries and archives and develop a YACR Acquisitions policy and a YACR Disposal policy. I consider that these will be best developed in collaboration with the staff in the Minster and York University so that the policies may take account of their concerns and plans as well as ours.

I am hopeful that alongside these developments we may have discussions in several places about what happens to items and records that YACR really wish to keep but which may be viewed by the Minster Library as 'not worthy of holding'. From these discussions we will develop guidance for towers and individuals about alternative safe and accessible places to store such items. Digitisation may be part of the solution to ensuring we keep safely, in perpetuity in the Minster Library collections or elsewhere, the very many interesting photographs, published and handwritten books and scripts, letters, quotations, Bell-dedication service sheets and other artefacts and papers that towers have kept safe for decades.

SAFEGUARDING OFFICER'S REPORT

The significant effect of the pandemic on the Association's strategy to extend Safeguarding Awareness Training was the enforced cancellation of the event in place for the Leeds & District Branch in October 2020. Plans are in hand to revive this during the latter half of 2021. Please look out for further announcements as the year progresses. Other Branches will also be offered the opportunity.

The Church of England has been reviewing its current provisions for Safeguarding Training with a view to revising the content of its Online Courses. The Basic Awareness Module, C0, is likely to be revamped and improved. It is available online only, and this is the module that all ringers are strongly encouraged to undertake. Module C1 is proposed to undergo changes including some content from C2. This module will be offered online, or in classroom, and again all ringers are encouraged to avail themselves of this opportunity for development. The timetable for change has yet to be announced.

The enforced cessation of ringing has led to an exponential rise in the use of online platforms such as Ringing Room, usually used alongside apps such as Skype, Zoom and the like. These play a valuable role in enabling interest in ringing to be maintained and holding bands together. It does mean, however, that care needs to be exercised in the conduct of online activity where children and vulnerable adults are concerned. CCCBR is working on guidelines to advise on the safe conduct of online ringing and training. Look out for these as 2021 progresses.

There was no other activity to report in 2020.

This allowed us to start planning the virtual summer school for 2021 in good time.

Building on the replies to the education-related questions in the 2020 survey that we required more courses that were more inclusive we organised and presented several online courses. These were held during the last quarter of the year together with practices for the attendees. These proved sufficiently satisfactory that we continued to offer courses into 2021. We also have a new fancy registration system. The slides used in the online courses are available via the Education page of the website in pdf format.

The YACR bookstall has changed its format. There is a list of books for sale on the website for people to buy. If requested, books can be brought to meetings.

GIFT AID OFFICER'S REPORT

The Gift Aid repayment for 2020 amounted to £247.71. The claim was submitted to HMRC on 12 January 2021 and was repaid by them on 1 February 2021.

As might be expected, the element of the claim relating to cash collections at meetings at £27.71 is very much less than previous years due to the virus lockdowns effective from March. The only opportunity for a collection in 2020 was at the Beverley meeting in February.

I would make my annual plea for individuals and towers to consider making donations to the BRF particularly at the present time when there is a possibility that the Association might not be able to make its annual contribution to the Fund. The relevant forms can be downloaded from the Association website and I would be only too pleased to answer any queries that might arise.

Finally, once again donations from online shopping contributed usefully to the BRF funds amounting to £220 from the easyfundraising and amazon websites.

YORKSHIRE YOUNG RINGERS (YORKSHIRE TYKES)

What a year 2020 turned out to be. Early in the year the Tykes held meetings in January at Ripon Cathedral (12) and Sharow (8) with a good turn out of ringers and celebrated Noah's birthday with tea and cakes. In February we visited Kippax (6) and Swillington (8) where the local ringers provided a delicious ringers tea.

On 7th March 2020 we enjoyed a great day out to the Durham area. Eighteen of our young ringers attended and we rang at Staindrop (8), and Brancepeth (8), then onto Durham itself, ringing at St Nicholas (6), and St Oswald (8) before finishing with the long climb up the Cathedral tower steps to ring on the 10 bells there. Everyone got plenty of ringing at each tower and it was a pleasure to see a Tykes team master the difficult bells at the Cathedral.

Little did we know that was to be our last real ringing of 2020. Unfortunately, no ringing was possible after lockdown started, and sadly the Ringing World National Youth Contest we were due to host in York in July was also cancelled. Many thanks to the York Branch ringers who had made all the arrangements for the contest, hopefully it will return to York in 2023.

The cancellation of the RWNYC was particularly disappointing for three of our ringers as it would have been their final contest with the Tykes - it would have been great to send them off on a high with a win on home turf. We thank all three of them for their commitment to the Tykes and wish them well as they continue their ringing at University.

In 2021 the RWNYC will hopefully be held in Worcester on 11th September, we do intend to enter a team and fortunately have some excellent young ringers coming along to replace those who have left us.

November and December saw the group meet online using Ringing Room and Zoom, these meetings will continue on a monthly basis until we are able to ring normally again.

We welcome all young ringers from across Yorkshire to join our meetings. If you have ringers in your towers who haven't tried a Tykes meeting yet please ask them to get in touch and we will include them on our mailing list. Parents and/or Tower Captains are allowed to attend with them. For more information contact Jane Lynch.

Allocations During 2020

At the meeting in February the following projects were allocated grants in 2020:

Pontefract St Giles	Total Project: £16,262	Grant of £2,000
Aysgarth	Total Project: £1,432	Grant of £150

(Please note the project total costs above sometimes differ from the actual project total costs since the Bell Repair Fund can only support certain costs. Also, the Total Project Costs are plus VAT).

There are two grants outstanding from before 2020:

Bolsterstone Grant offered £5,800 - they hope their large project will be completed in 2021.

Queensbury Grant offered £100 - this is for some minor works.

In addition, for two towers where in 2018 we offered a grant we have now lowered the level of grant to "Support". This is where we have said we will support a project but have not given a specific grant figure.

Laughton en le Morthen: They will be reapplying for a grant when work that is being carried out on the tower is completed. This will be for a transferred ring of bells for a new tower in Yorkshire.

Lindley: They are weighing up options for funding.

During 2020 four grants were paid out following completion of schemes at the following:-

Aysgarth	£150	Pontefract St Giles	£2,000
Barwick	£100	Whitkirk	£1,250

Some of this work was completed at the end of 2019 but due to invoice dates falls into 2020.

We have now provided bells from the Colin Ashworth bequest for the following towers: **Richmond, Barton, Beverley St Mary and Horbury.**

There were no new bells cast out of this bequest in 2020.

Even though churches have been shut or not running as they would in other years the bell hanging industry is still active and projects are still going on. The Trustees have been meeting on Zoom and our meetings have been successful. After long periods of bells not being rung the Central Council guidance is to check your bells and make sure everything is how it should be in the belfry. It is always worth remembering ongoing maintenance can help prolong the need for expensive refurbishment work.

We are looking at various ways for finding homes for bells where they are no longer needed in their current churches. This process is not straightforward by any means, and we are building a good relationship with the Keltek Trust. Their Secretary has joined us for the last two meetings making the most of us having them on Zoom. His input has been beneficial to us. I ask members to keep me informed if they know of any churches that may be closing and bells that might be becoming available for transfer. Also, if you know of a church that could rehouse second-hand bells please let me know at the earliest opportunity. We now have a list on our website of any Yorkshire bells that are available to be transferred to other towers.

Due to changes outside of the Yorkshire Association and the BRF that have taken place in recent years we are currently reviewing and updating our Voluntary Code of Practice for the transfer of Bells which was set out in 2000. We are working with church authorities and other interested parties on this.

On the fundraising side of the BRF we are in the planning stages of running a lottery/100 club fundraiser. We hope this will be launched in 2022; this has been put back due to the events of 2020.

With plans for subscriptions to be cancelled for 2022 this is going to have a negative impact on the funding of the BRF. It has been suggested that those who wish to, can donate their subscription to the BRF. This will help bridge the gap in funding.

The next two meetings of the Trustees will be held in September 2021 and February 2022 to consider applications for support and grants. The closing dates for applications are 30th June and 31st December 2021 respectively. Applications should be submitted using the YACR BRF form A and sent to the BRF Secretary: Peter McCoy. If you are considering a project, please contact me so that I can supply you with the correct form and offer any advice you may require.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has donated money, time, labour and effort to the Bell Repair Fund in 2020. In 2019 the trustees put forward some rule changes to the general meeting. I hope the changes the committee have made in recent years are making a difference.

Trustees are appointed every year by the General Committee. If you would be interested in becoming a Trustee, please contact myself or the general secretary. As we fall within the rules set out by the Charities Commission there are certain conditions which apply as to who can become a trustee.

For further information to allow for a full understanding of the financial affairs of the Bell Repair Fund the full annual accounts and the Trustees' annual report should be consulted. Copies of these documents are obtainable from the Association Treasurer for a reasonable fee to cover costs or alternately we have the most recent full reports available for download on the YACR website.

LEEDS AND DISTRICT BRANCH REPORT

The year started pretty much as normal with ringing on the new six at Seacroft, with the added attraction of tea, coffee and biscuits, followed by ringing at Barwick in Elmet, with a good attendance at each.

As a change to the usual proceedings we held our AGM in February. Ringing was at Kirk Deighton with other attractions – bookstall, video, quiz etc – in the church at the same time. This was followed by a lovely tea (complete with waitress service) and the AGM in the new village hall. At the AGM Penny Thorley retired from her role as treasurer and John Burnup retired from the committee; Penny had been on the committee for many years, including a spell as secretary as well as being treasurer, and John had been on the committee for twelve years, including four years as chairman. Both were thanked for their work.

March followed with ringing at Thornhill and Horbury, although by now the Covid clouds were beginning to gather, and less than two weeks later we went into lockdown with all ringing prohibited.

There was no ringing for Easter Day in April or for the celebrations that had been planned for the 75th anniversary of VE Day in May. Some churches opened again in July and this paved the way for an initial return to ringing – taking numerous precautions including having to ring with a mask on, 2+ metres apart. Some towers – Barwick in Elmet, Far Headingley, Horbury, Harrogate St. Peter, Kirk Deighton, Knaresborough, Leeds Cathedral, Leeds Minster, Pontefract St. Giles and Seacroft - were able to ring regularly on Sundays between July and October, albeit on a limited number of bells for only fifteen minutes, and others rang occasionally. Socially-distanced ringing or tolling of a single

bell also took place at several towers for VJ Day on 15th August. Far Headingley and Horbury each rang for a funeral during the summer and Leeds Cathedral rang for two ordination services.

At Christmas, ringing was allowed 1+ metre apart on up to six bells; all of the towers that had rung through the summer except one rang on Christmas Day although most didn't take advantage of the relaxation in restrictions. However, Barwick in Elmet rang all six of their bells, as did Chapel Allerton, who were ringing for the first time since restrictions began, and Knaresborough also rang six. Pontefract St Giles, Kirk Deighton and Seacroft also took advantage of the relaxed restrictions ringing five, four and three bells respectively.

More than half the towers in the branch haven't rung at all since March. Almost all bands have kept in touch with one another by phone or e-mail (and only rarely by Zoom or any other 'virtual' method); some have met, at church services or church-organised activities, for coffee, walks, and one group got together for some 'socially-distanced' bell maintenance, so I'm sure that we are all eager to get back together ringing too, just as soon as conditions allow. Two towers have also been approached by people who want to learn to ring; 2021 can only be better.

QUARTER PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Criteria used for including quarter peals:-

I have used the same criteria as applied in previous years for collating YACR quarter peals. I have used Duco Software and included all performances submitted as quarter peals to Bellboard, attributed to the Yorkshire Association, between 1st January 2020 and 31st December 2020.

I have also included 2 quarter peals, during the same date parameters, which were jointly attributed to the Yorkshire Association and Beverley and District Ringing Society, and 2 from Ringing Room attributed to (1) Yorkshire Association and Scarborough and District and (1) Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. The figures listed below for leading ringers and conductors relate only to quarters attributed to the YACR, although several of those YACR members have also conducted or rung more quarters attributed to other societies.

The Statistics:

112 quarter peals were rung in 53 different towers/locations by 281 different ringers and 52 different conductors. 23 of these quarters were on handbells and 2 via the Hand Bell Stadium UK.

5 quarter peals were rung in Ringing Room Yorkshire and a further 2 via Ringing Room - 1 jointly attributed to the Yorkshire Association and Scarborough and District and the other Yorkshire and Lincolnshire.

As per quarter peal footnotes, 11 people rang their first quarter peal during 2020 and 4 people conducted their first quarter peal.

Various points of interest:-

The 2020 number of monthly quarter peals hugely reflected the changing rules and regulations in the UK in relation to the Coronavirus pandemic. In January and February 34 quarter peals were rung each month but this dropped to 12 in March with the implementation of the UK lockdown on March 23rd. In July there were 6 quarter peals rung, 5 in October and for the remaining months of the year this varied between 1 and 4 per month. Social distancing, tier regulations and the non-mixing of different households led to an increase in quarter peals being rung in Ringing Room and on handbells. The ringing of handbells has been slightly less restrictive than tower ringing due to the rule of 6 and the ability to ring outdoors socially-distanced. During 2020 we have seen church bells falling silent, churches closing and many other restrictions placed on us all. There was a period of brief respite when ringing was permitted, following social distance guidelines, for 15 minutes per occasion and with the

requirement that all ringers wore face masks, but tier restrictions then curtailed the much anticipated Christmas ringing.

Throughout the year quarter peals were rung for Sunday services, birthdays, wedding anniversaries, memorials, leap day, epiphany, the fight against Covid 19, to mark the 75th anniversaries of VE and VJ day, Remembrance Day and Holocaust Day.

Other quarter peals of interest included the start of the 900th anniversary year of St Peter's in Felkirk, whilst in Kirkburton, All Hallows celebrated the centenary of the first ringing of their bells which took place on February 14th 1920.

St Andrew's in Kildwick recorded the achievements of first quarters rung by 2 of their mini ringers.

In January, 2 young ringers, one from All Saints, Northallerton and one from All Saints, Huntington both had notable achievements conducting their first quarter peals.

Up to 31st December 2020, there had been 72,178 deaths as a result of Coronavirus in the UK and this is continuing to rise to date. I am sure I speak for us all in saying 2020 has been a difficult year, our thoughts are with those who have lost loved ones and we remain positive that 2021 will herald a brighter future.

I trust that the criteria I have used is acceptable, accurate and relevant.

PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 2020 peal total of 78 was the lowest since 1944, for the obvious reason that most ringing was suspended due to the Covid-19 pandemic after 16 March for the rest of the year. A more meaningful comparison is that up to the suspension of ringing, 74 peals had been rung, compared with 69 in the same period in 2019. Tower bell peals were down by 202 at 64 from the previous year, and handbell peals down by 21 to 14 – perhaps slightly surprising that only one band arranged handbell peals during lockdown.
